

Barbecues at Bunn Leisure

We do understand that you may wish to have a barbecue whilst staying on park. Unfortunately the casual and sometimes thoughtless use of barbecues has resulted in serious injuries, fires, damage and inconsideration to neighbours. In order to promote responsible use and create safer environments Bunn Leisure maintains a barbecue policy.

Barbecues at Bunn Leisure

- Disposable barbecues of any kind are NOT permitted on any part of Bunn Leisure.
- Barbecues are not permitted on any part of the beach.
- If you wish to have a barbecue you must first obtain the permission of the Security Management team who will require that the following considerations will be met.
 - You have completed and documented a risk assessment.
 - The barbecue is fit for purpose.
 - It will be located in a place that is level and not close to any combustible materials and items.
 - It will not cause a disturbance to other persons or smoke ingress to other caravans.
 - You have an extinguisher, fire blanket or other appropriate fire fighting equipment.
 - Only recognised fire lighters or starter fuel designed for the purpose will be used.
 - Your barbecue will be manned at all times until it is fully extinguished and has cooled off.
 - You have a safe plan to dispose of any coals.
 - The area will be cleared and left tidy.

A risk assessment and key requirements form are available at reception or from Security Control. The Security Management can only sanction a barbecue if all of the above conditions have been met to their complete satisfaction. They may at their discretion impose further requirements or relocate the barbecue to one of the designated barbecue areas more suited to the nature of the intended barbecue.

General Safety

1. Make sure the barbecue is in good structural order and fully servicable.
2. Ensure the barbecue is positioned on a flat surface.
3. Keep children, games and pets well away from the cooking area.
4. NEVER leave the barbecue unattended.
5. Keep a bucket of water or sand nearby for emergencies.
6. If you are using charcoal - use only enough to cover the base to a depth of about 50mm (2 inches).
7. Use only fire lighters. Never a highly flammable liquid or substance such as petrol.
8. If you are using a gas barbecue - After cooking turn off the gas cylinder before turning off the controls to ensure any residual gas in the pipe work is used up.
9. Ensure the barbecue is cool before attempting to move it to storage.
10. NEVER put hot coals and ash into refuse bins.
